Innkeepers Jim and Donna Winner bought the property unseen to preserve the historical landmark in their home state.

The surrounding gardens, carriage house, regal parlor, fireplaces and timeless sense of luxury embrace you as soon as you pull up in the driveway.

"I think the true luxury and romance of the building is the pampering of the staff. We have staff available 24 hours a day from the minute a guest arrives and we give them a glass of champagne," General Manager Laura Ackley described. The once federal-style red brick farmhouse evolved into a whitewashed, pillared, plantation-looking home after a grandson of the original owner fell in love with southern hospitality.

im and Donna Winner purchased the landmark in 1984, built two additions and have transformed the mansion into a tribute to the civil war era.



The 27-room inn has incorporated 'Gone With The Wind' memorabilia in their packages and décor. "There are a number of memorabilia pieces from the movie. We have Vivian Leigh's bed jacket from a honeymoon scene and Clark Gable's dressing gown. We also have Vivian Leigh's personal collection of photos she took on set," Director of Marketing, Laura Ackley described. For the swooning belles in all of us, there are some hand written letters from Clark Gable on display and the inn boasts one of the largest Civil War gun collections in the country. Even the staff dress in hoop gowns as they greet and meet your needs. The inn's two dining choices range from Ashley's Gourmet dining room that includes a seven-course meal with white-gloved service, to the more casual Stonewall's Tavern.
